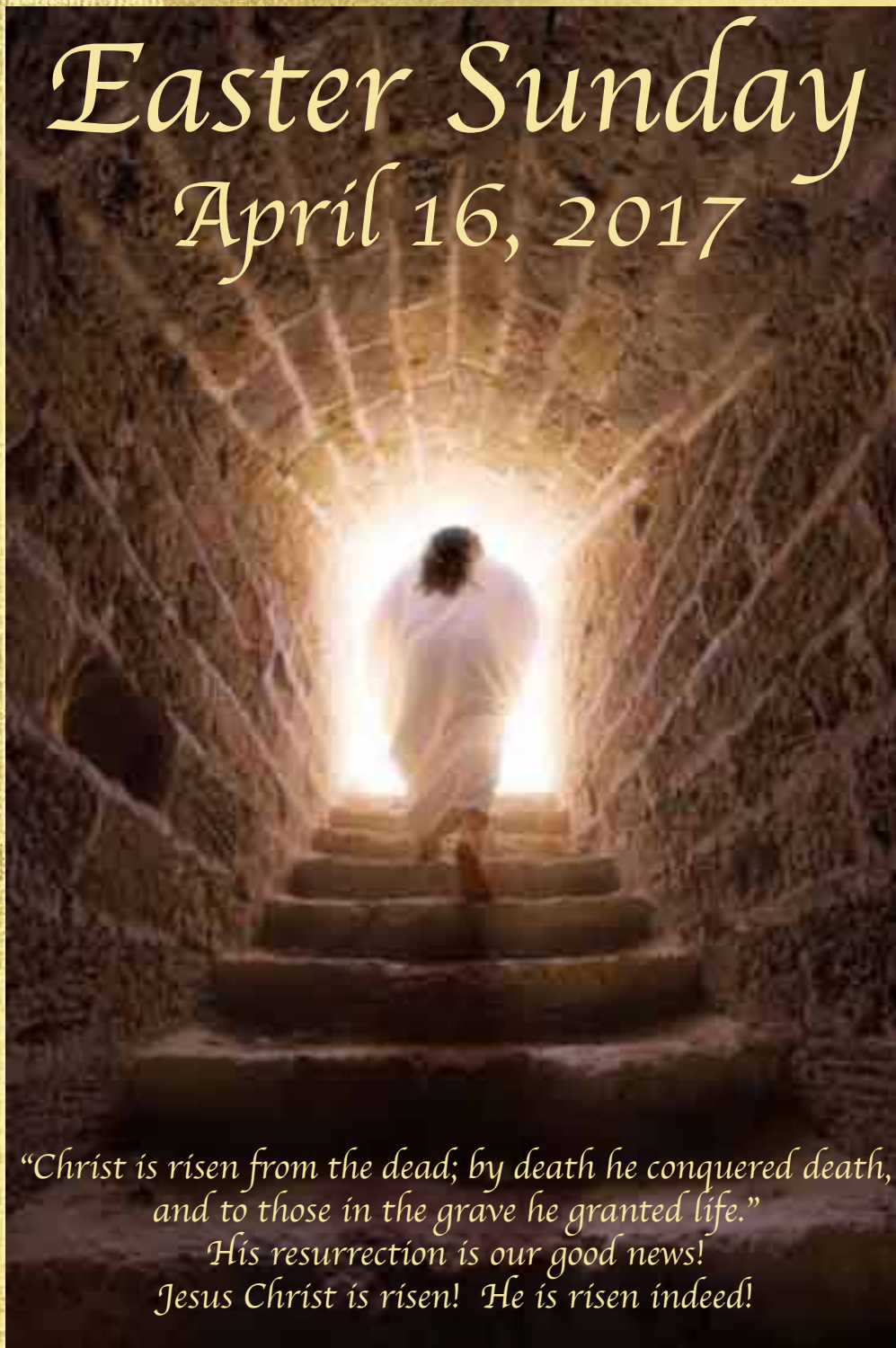

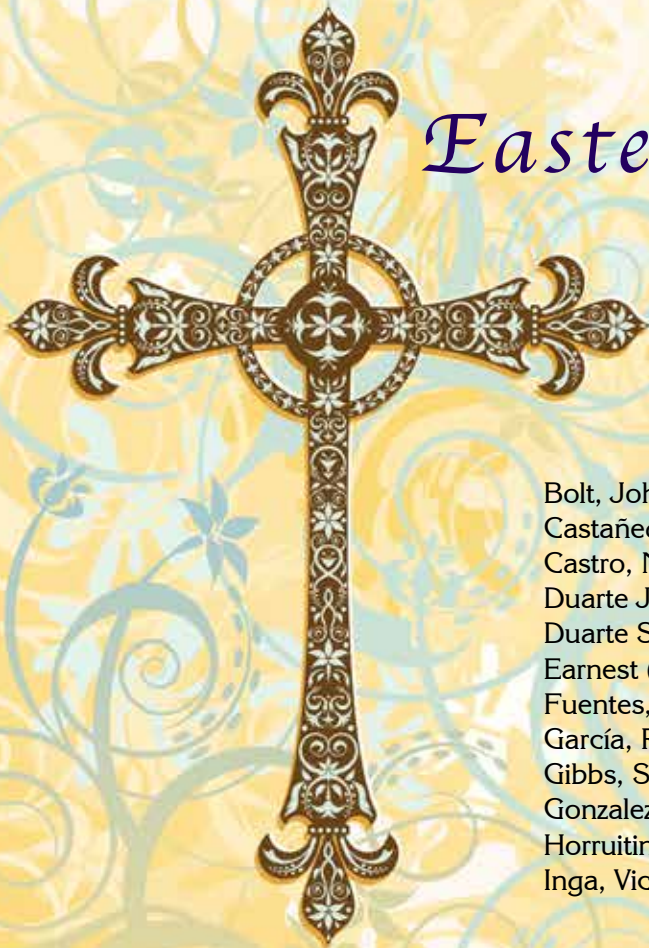

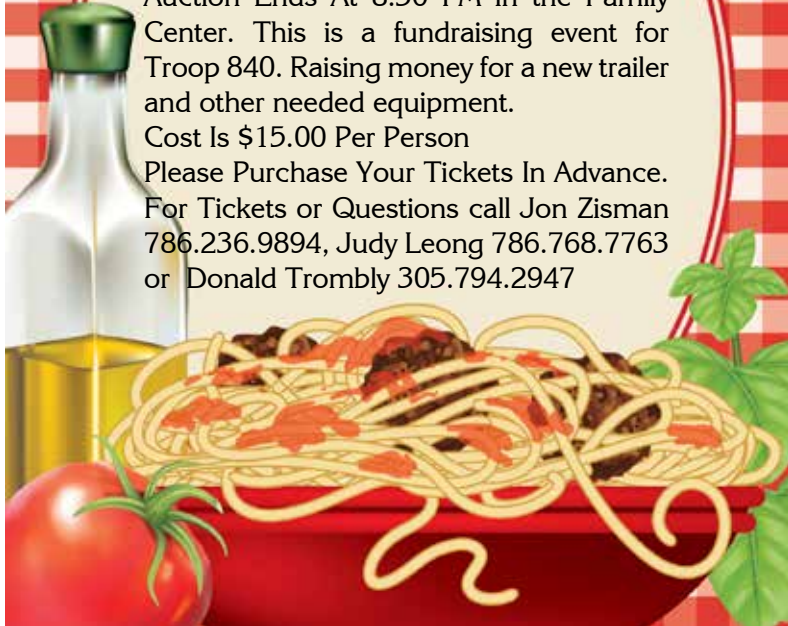

Midnight Musings

Good News



Jesus Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!

Hiroimi from Japan went to Barry University where she met a Catholic gentleman named Yves. They married. They lived together in his mother's home in Miramar, where his aging mother was growing weaker and weaker. She died and we celebrated the funeral at our parish, St. Bartholomew in Miramar. Hiroimi was so impressed with the way her mother-in-law and her husband Yves faced death. She was so amazed by the beauty of our Catholic funeral liturgy. This death and funeral led her to the decision to join our RCIA and prepare for baptism herself.

Coming from the world of Eastern religions that believe in reincarnation, she excitedly told me how wonderful the doctrine of the resurrection was. In the viewpoint of reincarnation people keep coming back to different lives over and over. In the Christian doctrine of resurrection people go forward to a new life. She exclaimed that this was wonderful— not a constant return over and over, but the hope of finally reaching the goal of fulfilled life. Reincarnation almost sounds like “recycling.” We recycle aluminum cans. People don't get recycled; they move ahead to a new life. Admittedly we are not perfect when we leave this world, but we don't have to go back to earth and try again. We go forward, perhaps through the purifying and perfecting process of purgatory, so that we can enjoy heaven. But we go forward as the unique individuals that we are to the fullness of life in God.

This basically means that everything that we are as individuals and in our relationships does not stop at death. Resurrection promises that the unique person, that each of us, is will ultimately find fulfillment. I, me, my life, my connections with others, everything that I am— these will be healed and resurrected to a perfection.

That's why we call the Easter message gospel or “good news”— our lives have meaning now and we are going to live forever. What God did for Jesus he wants to do for us. The apostles realized that on Easter Sunday. Pilate did not have the last word in the story of Jesus; God did. We live in the love of God made present in Christ and that love promises that God never lets go of us and thus we shall live forever.

In the resurrection icon of Eastern Christianity (see the attached picture), Jesus is depicted as sharing his Easter victory with others. He stand victoriously over the broken gates of death and reaches out to raise his ancestors Adam and Eve (representing the whole human race), themselves surrounded by other characters of the Old Testament tradition, including John the Baptist. Beneath the gates of death, the devil is bound in the agony of his defeat. Eastern Christians sing of this victory of Christ: “Christ is risen from the dead; by death he conquered death, and to those in the grave he granted life.” His resurrection is our good news!

Jesus Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!

Pensamientos de Media Noche

Buenas noticias

¡Jesucristo ha resucitado! ¡En Verdad ha resucitado!

Hiromi de Japón fue a la Universidad Barry donde conoció a un caballero católico llamado Yves. Ellos están casados. Vivían juntos en la casa de su madre en Miramar, donde su anciana madre se estaba debilitando cada vez más. Ella murió y celebramos el funeral en la parroquia, San Bartolomé en Miramar. Hiromi estaba tan impresionada con la forma en que su suegra y su marido Yves se enfrentaron a la muerte. Ella estaba tan asombrada por la belleza de nuestra liturgia funeral católica. Esta muerte y funeral la llevó a la decisión de unirse a nuestro RCIA y prepararse para el bautismo.

Viniendo del mundo de las religiones orientales que creen en la reencarnación, ella emocionadamente me dijo lo maravillosa que era la doctrina de la resurrección. En el punto de vista de la reencarnación la gente sigue volviendo a diferentes vidas una y otra vez. En la doctrina cristiana de la resurrección, las personas avanzan hacia una nueva vida. Ella exclamó que esto era maravilloso - no una vuelta constante, una y otra vez, pero la esperanza de alcanzar finalmente el objetivo de vida cumplida. La reencarnación casi suena como "reciclaje". Reciclamos latas de aluminio. La gente no se recicla; Ellos avanzan hacia una nueva vida. Es cierto que no somos perfectos cuando salimos de este mundo, pero no tenemos que volver a la tierra e intentarlo de nuevo. Avanzamos, tal vez a través del proceso de purificación y perfeccionamiento del purgatorio, para que podamos disfrutar del cielo. Pero seguimos adelante como los individuos únicos que somos a la plenitud de la vida en Dios.

Esto básicamente significa que todo lo que somos como individuos y en nuestras relaciones no se detiene en la muerte. La resurrección promete que la persona única, que cada uno de nosotros, es, en última instancia, encontrará plenitud. Yo, yo, mi vida, mis conexiones con los demás, todo lo que soy, estos serán sanados y resucitados a una perfección.

Es por eso que llamamos al mensaje de Pascua el evangelio o "buenas noticias" - nuestras vidas tienen sentido ahora y vamos a vivir para siempre. Lo que Dios hizo por Jesús quiere hacer por nosotros. Los apóstoles se dieron cuenta de que el domingo de Pascua. Pilato no tenía la última palabra en la historia de Jesús; Dios lo hizo. Vivimos en el amor de Dios hecho presente en Cristo y ese amor promete que Dios nunca nos deja ir y así viviremos para siempre.

En el icono de la resurrección del cristianismo oriental (véase el cuadro adjunto), Jesús es representado como compartir su victoria de Pascua con otros. Él está victorioso sobre las puertas rotas de la muerte y alcanza para levantar a sus antepasados Adán y Eva (representando a toda la raza humana), ellos mismos rodeados por otros caracteres de la tradición del Antiguo Testamento, incluyendo Juan el Bautista. Bajo las puertas de la muerte, el diablo está atado en la agonía de su derrota. Los cristianos orientales cantan esta victoria de Cristo: "Cristo ha resucitado de entre los muertos; Por la muerte él conquistó la muerte, ya los que en el sepulcro concedió la vida. "¡Su resurrección es nuestra buena noticia!

¡Jesucristo ha resucitado! ¡Él ha resucitado!
